
CALL FOR PROPOSALS



1925 was a banner year for Midwestern literature. Important novels published that year include F. Scott Fitzgerald's *The Great Gatsby*, Willa Cather's *The Professor's House*, Ernest Hemingway's *In Our Time*, Theodore Dreiser's *An American Tragedy*, and Sinclair Lewis's *Arrowsmith*. To celebrate the 100th anniversary of this important year, the Society for the Study of Midwestern Literature invites essay proposals for a special issue of its peer-reviewed journal *Midwestern Miscellany* on the topic of "Midwestern Literature in 1925," to be edited by Scott Emmert (University of Wisconsin Oshkosh). Proposals may focus on the famous novels of 1925 or texts / authors that have been overshadowed by Fitzgerald, Cather, Hemingway, Dreiser, and Lewis.



Proposals should be no more than 300 words and should include a brief critical bibliography. Completed essays should be between 3,000 and 5,000 words. Contributors must be members of SSML before publication.
